



Unprecedented Response

The COVID-19 crisis threw a rod into Indiana's economic engines, bringing Hoosiers to a halt as many faced financial hardship, the loss of a job, and food insecurity. Lines of cars waiting at food banks became a common sight. The food bank supply chain suddenly shifted into hyperdrive and our work behind the scenes grew to match that of the front line work feeding hungry Hoosiers.
